Following Pine Hills Camp, we launched a new initiative for seventh and eighth grade girls called Talitha Koum. Our time together included a powerful talk, small group discussion, Adoration, and praise and worship. Each week more than seventy girls gathered; it was beautiful to help them encounter Jesus in a personal way. We sense a great need for more ways to help middle school girls be firmly rooted in their faith as they navigate our challenging, contemporary culture and prepare for high school, so we will continue to minister to this age group throughout the school year.

More than eighty, seven-to-elevenyear-old girls gathered for a fun and faith-filled evening of singing, dancing, crafts, a photo booth, snacks and a message about their identity as God's precious and beloved daughters.

Each Tuesday at 9 a.m. this summer about twenty high schoolers showed up to study Philippians. We learned practical ways to apply God's truth to our lives and be more firmly rooted in Christ. Our study of Ephesians continues Tuesdays at 6:30 a.m. throughout the school year.

Our small groups meet year-round providing a place for teen girls to grow in prayer and experience personal support and friendship with other girls in their grade.

With great praise to the Lord for its growth and flourishing, the Tribes of Zion (Zion) is Renewal Ministries' outreach to high school boys. Now in its third year, Zion is not only meeting the spiritual needs of ninth-through twelfth-grade boys but also building spiritual fellowship among its leadership team of young adult men.

According to Zion's director, Joey Mc-Coy, the ministry grew out of a highly successful, middle-school summer camp for boys. McCoy explains;

"Zion began as an attempt to help boys coming out of one week of Pine Hills camp to grow in their faith over the rest of the year. We assign each boy to a small group called a 'tribe', and each tribe meets once a week. We endeavor to help the boys get the feel of being on a spiritual team, in a spiritual family, and having a communal place of belonging and spiritual growth. During our weekly meetings, tribe leaders guide the boys through physical challenges, practices, or competitions designed to help form the masculine soul. Last summer we had nights focusing on repentance, how to resist temptation, and training in the habit of silence. Although Zion grew from our desire to meet the needs of Pine Hill's campers, we welcome any high school boy interested in deepening his faith."

This past summer, thirteen Zion tribe leaders ministered to approximately forty high school boys from five area high schools. One high-energy activity enjoyed by the boys was a supervised, trivia-based race through the streets of Ann Arbor. After the race, tribe members engaged college students in conversation on the campus of the

University of Michigan. They posed serious questions to the college students such as.

"What is your source of truth?" and "Who is Jesus to you?"

McCoy recalls that the experience was formative and unifying.

"Each of our souls was on fire with charity as we listened diligently to these strangers engage with questions of extreme significance."

Over the next year, tribe leaders will help the high schoolers learn, experience, and practice what Zion calls the five core identities of Christ's humanity. These core identities carry the titles of:

Pilgrim, Warrior, Heir, Friend, and Story-Bearer.

Rightly concluding that they cannot give the high-schoolers what they do not have, the Zion leadership team of young adult men also meets weekly to share a meal and to be formed in the faith. McCoy shares,

"When Zion men gather there is an otherworldly peace, a oneness, and a stillness that settles into us. We feel God dwelling amidst his people. The leadership team has become a brotherhood, encouraging each other in big life events like getting engaged, married, and having children. Two Zion guys have even headed off to the seminary!"

Looking to the future, McCoy adds that the group has begun to wonder if the Lord might intend Zion to be transformed into a school. "The need is great to form boys into men," says McCoy. "Please pray for us to have wisdom and patience as we strive to zealously, courageously, and obediently stick to God's will for Zion."



Ralph Martin (RM): I was very moved by your National Catholic Register article about your dad while he was dying. People need to hear that, because we will all stand before the judgment seat of Christ, and those last moments matter. I've been grieved during Covid to hear of so many situations in which priests aren't allowed to or don't want to help dying patients. I'm concerned about people dying without the opportunity to receive assistance in being reconciled to the Lord.

Dan Burke (DB): There's also a theological position that's been popularized in our time – the view that we don't have to worry. That's horrifying. My dad was dying, and I knew he was going to hell. And he's a good man, so how does that work?

RM: Explain that.

DB: He was agnostic and never went to church his whole life, except for funerals and weddings, yet he wasn't against religion. The priest who helped me help him at the end of his life said people usually die as they live. Last minute conversions are not common—but I prayed so hard. Every time I went to see him, I prayed the rosary and asked the Blessed Mother to ask him to ask me a question. He was a self-made man. He didn't have any education, but

by the time he was thirty, he had made a million in revenue in his company and owned two homes. His dad was a philanderer and an alcoholic, his mom was a single mom, and he was poor. And he did so well, and he was a self-made man. He had a very strong and imposing personality. It was very difficult to show the faith, but I fought to do so.

RM: The interest had to come from him, so that's what you prayed for.

DB: That was my secret! I was forward with him, but it was hard. It was easier when he led. One time he asked me,

"Dan, does it bother you that I'm not religious like you?"

I was like, "Oh, God, thank you." I gave a terrible answer in the moment because I was really tired, but it gave me the opportunity to write a letter, and I said,

"I love you, and you're a good man, but that's not what solves the problem of sin."

He had an aortic aneurysm in April 2019 and became very sick. He had always been very strong in body. I was in a hotel down the street from the ICU, and I prayed, "Lord, please give me one more chance to share the Gospel with him, when he's lucid and alone."

I woke up at 1:30 a.m., and I heard, "Go now." I thought he was going to die. I didn't think it was an answer to that other prayer. I called my wife and asked her to start praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet. I started praying it too, and when I got there, he was lucid and almost alone. My estranged brother who had been on drugs for a long time, and who I didn't have a relationship with, was there. I knew it was the moment that I had asked for. I said, "Dad, I really want to see you again when this is all over. And I want you to see Linda." She was my sister, who died in her thirties. He loved her dearly. and she was the only other Christian in the family.

He asked, "What are you talking about?" I said,

"You're going to die. You've been a good man, but that does not solve the problem of sin. That's why Jesus came – to give his life on our behalf that we might be reconciled to the Father and that we might be able to go to heaven. I really want to see you in heaven."

I said, "Dad, do you want to be forgiven?" And he said, "Yes."

I said, "Dad, just ask Him for forgiveness." He said, "I don't know how." He'd never prayed in his life.

I said, "Just say, 'God, please forgive me." He balled up his fists and prayed with all of his might, "God, please forgive me. God, please forgive me. God, please forgive me."

I said, "Dad, can I baptize you?" I knew canonically we can do that in a difficult situation. I found a Styrofoam cup in the hospital ICU. I don't know what I was doing. I dipped my thumb in the water and crossed his forehead, saying, "In the name of the Father." My dad is not religious, and he was like, "Wow." And then I crossed him again, "In the name of the Son." And he said, "Wow." And then I crossed him again, and he said, "Wow."

And my brother, who I hadn't talked to in fifteen to twenty years, was bawling on the other side of the bed.

Later, my dad asked, "Does this make me a Catholic now?"

I said, "It does." He said, "Great."

After that, he just kept recovering. And my wife Stephanie, an evangelist extraordinaire, said, "You've got to get him confirmed, and you've got to get him Eucharist and Last Rites."

RM: She's sending you back for more work!

DB: I got him to say yes to forgiveness, and I didn't want to hear no; it would kill me!

I asked, "Dad, will you please see a priest to pray over you?" He had never agreed to this before, but he said yes – baptismal graces. I called a priest who confirmed him and gave him Eucharist and Last Rites.

When I asked how it went, he said, "Great. I picked St. Christopher as my Confirmation saint. Is that OK?"

I said, "Yeah, how did you pick St. Christopher?"

"Only saint I ever heard of!"

Then, we went back to spend time with him in the ICU. He woke Stephanie up one night and said, "I've been talking to St. Christopher" – he wasn't a religious guy. Stephanie said, "What about, Dad?" He said, "We've been standing at the edge of the water, talking about how to get across."

Stephanie said, "That's beautiful. Do you want to know the secret?"

He said, "Yeah I do." She said, "It's surrender."

He said, "That's hard for a man like me." Then he went back to sleep.

Later, while he was in at-home hospice, he said to Stephanie, "I've been talking to Christopher."

She said, "What about?" He said, "He's been teaching me the faith."

Just amazing stuff like that. Later, we thought he was going to die. We closed his eyes, and his pulse was down. He went to sleep, and we made everyone – a real interesting group of characters – pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. They all agreed, and we gathered around and prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

My dad opened his eyes when we finished, and said,

"Wow, that was a long prayer!"

Then he held out his hands in two fists and opened them, saying,

"But you know what? When you let it in, it's really beautiful."

RM: There's a lesson here for everybody. I'm concerned right now that many people are indifferent about whether people who are dying have the Sacrament of the Sick, a chance to talk with a priest, or a chance to talk with anybody about where they are in relationship with the Lord. I want to tell everyone to intercede for the salvation of souls and for those you know who are dying. When my wife wakes up in the middle of the night,

she prays the Divine Mercy Chaplet for those who are dying. Really intercede, really ask the Lord to have mercy on them and to send somebody. You may be the one who gets sent, but it may be somebody else – a nurse in the hospital or a guardian angel. I'm so concerned about people dying without being reconciled to the Lord.

DB: I totally agree. If you die in a state of mortal sin, you die in a state where you are telling God, "I don't want your plan." He's not going to violate your will. He's going to ratify that, and you're going to go to hell.

If somebody you love has not gone to Confession, or they have unforgiveness, or they've not lived in a proper state, you need to fight like heaven to get the hell out of them. Really get in there and love them more than you love your comfort. That's the hardest part. Love them more than what it's going to feel like to get rejected. I thought that was what was going to happen with my dad, but it didn't. You've got to give the Holy Spirit room to work, and you've got to cooperate with the Holy Spirit. If you're the only one who knows - and I am in my family - you're the one. You have to go, you have to pray, you have to fast, and you have to pray the rosary. Ask the Lord to have them ask you. It worked for me.

RM: Like Mary said in Fatima, offer suffering in reparation for sin and conversion of sinners. Offer voluntary suffering. Offer the suffering that you're experiencing. Turn it into a prayer, turn it into pleading for the salvation of souls.
