

SPREADING THE GOSPEL IN SLOVAKIA

BRATISLAVA, SLOVAKIA ↻

Upon arrival in Budapest, we were met by Bohdan and drove three and one-half hours to the capital city of Bratislava, where we had been invited to the Naim Community. We spent three days with this Community, the core of which is comprised of families who have been gathering together since 2003. We spent two days conducting events for the Community, and then, in their first attempt at a parish event since the onset of Covid, we were all surprised by a turnout of about ninety people! Jean Marie and Patricia shared moving testimonies of overcoming trials, and Tom presented teachings on *Faith that Overcomes Obstacles*, *Proclaiming Jesus as Lord*, and *Be Not Afraid*. As it was with all of the places we visited, there was pent-up hunger and thirst for teaching and personal ministry.

ORAVA, SLOVAKIA

From Bratislava, we made a five-hour drive to the town of Orava in north-eastern Slovakia, one of the regions hit particularly hard by Covid. Churches in the region, including the one we visited, had been completely closed for months, and all residents were still required to wear N95-type masks. Despite this, the parish priest stepped out in faith and gave an open invitation for people to come to an evening of renewal and personal prayer. We were amazed when nearly 300 people arrived! Prayer ministry continued into the late hours of the evening.

Following an evening of spiritual renewal in Orava, participants were eager to receive prayer for healing and a greater anointing of the Holy Spirit. ↻

Despite the Covid-19 pandemic, we were thrilled to be able to travel to Slovakia in October of 2021 for our annual mission outreach. Outreaches to Eastern European countries have been going for twenty-seven years now! Our mission team included Patricia Welther from Louisiana, USA, Bohdan Novak from Slovakia, me, and my wife, Jean Marie. We flew into Budapest, and our schedule was intense as we ministered in six different towns in just under two weeks. So many were eager to host our ministry that we could not accept all the invitations.



PRESOV, SLOVAKIA

Our next stop was in the town of Presov, where we have continued to cooperate with our long-time friends who belong to the Maranatha Community. The Community has grown exponentially with many young married couples and their children. Like most other places, the Covid-19 pandemic has taken its toll on in-person gatherings, but the Community continues to be innovative with virtual ministry and outreach. They are currently struggling to complete a new building which will seat 1000 people and provide several rooms for small groups. The outer structure has been constructed, but much electrical and finishing work remains.



For many years, Renewal Ministries has been involved in an event held in Presov called the Fire Rally or in the Slovak language, "Ohen." In past years, a local sports arena filled with nearly 7,000 people from around the country for the all-day event. In 2020 and again this year, the rally was broadcast virtually. The theme for 2021 was "Jesus is Everything I need," and our team was invited to be the event speakers!

We spent two days in the production studio recording videos, and the event was then streamed on YouTube and Facebook on October 30.

As of this writing, over 15,000 people have viewed some part of the event; praise be to God who does wondrous things! Our other venues in Presov included special meetings for small group leaders and worship leaders.

After leaving Presov, we continued on to conduct events in Poprad, Bardejov, and Vranov.

"The people of Slovakia are such a blessing for the Church. Many of the people I met while in Slovakia shared what life was like under Communism and told stories of how their faith flourished under persecution. When we gathered to deliver our message and pray with them in various churches, there was a real hunger for Jesus, for healing, and for a greater anointing of the Holy Spirit.
