

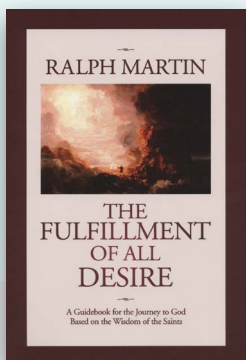

## Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Ralph has asked me to share some thoughts with you, and I am delighted to do so. I know some of you are wondering about my health. I continue to recover and gain strength back and am happy to be able to continue my daily radio programs. I've been praying for all of you so much, asking God to touch your hearts and bring Jesus closer to you.

These are very challenging times. Perhaps, they're orchestrated by the Lord to bring us to a place where we can really hear his Word. By which I mean for us not just to think nice, pious thoughts, but to hear his Word and have a relationship with Him and love Him.

You may say, "Oh, yes, I know God." Okay. But do you know Jesus Christ, the One whom the Father sent to this earth to teach us the way we needed to go? God wants a personal relationship with you. It isn't enough to say, "No, God," or "Yes, God," to this or that. The importance is in knowing Him. Knowing Him who loves you. Knowing the One whom you are called to love and whom you want to serve.

God wants to encourage you, especially in this time when everyone is confused and bewildered and wondering what's next on the list. We are all asking, "What will get worse, and is anything going to get better?"

We all have these kinds of thoughts. What we want to do with these thoughts is to take

them to the Lord and say, "Lord, I want to draw closer to you. I want to belong to you. Help me. Help me sit quietly with You every day, even if for just a few moments." And then just sit quietly every day. Tell God you love Him. Tell Him you want to follow Him. Ask Him to help you. He will be only too glad to help you. He died for you, not for billions. He died for each one of us. He promised us everlasting life if we follow him and draw close to Him.

**God sees you 24/7. God sees you. He knows what you are doing. He wants to relate to you. Each of us has a slightly different relationship with God. We each have different gifts and different abilities, but brothers and sisters, He wants a relationship with each of us.**

I read a book entitled *God or Nothing* by Cardinal Robert Sarah from Africa. The book is a conversation on faith, and in it Cardinal Sarah writes, "it is important to give individuals the opportunity for the experience of close encounters with Christ. Without such a heart-to-heart conversation, we are fooling ourselves if we think that people will follow

the Son of God in the long term. It reminds me of a saying of the Desert Fathers that left a deep impression on me during my biblical studies in Jerusalem. Translated from Coptic, it expresses the importance of the indispensable interior life in being a Christian:

“One monk met another and asked him, ‘Why do so many abandon the monastic life?’

‘Why?’ the other monk replied. ‘Monastic life is like a dog chasing a rabbit. It runs after the rabbit, barking. Many other dogs, hearing the bark, join in, and they all run together after the rabbit. But after a while, all the dogs that run without seeing the rabbit wonder, “Where are we going? Why are we running?” They become tired, get lost, and stop running, one after the other. Only the dogs that see the rabbit continue to pursue it to the end until they catch it.’ And the moral of that little story is this; only those whose eyes are fixed on the person of Christ on the cross persevere to the end.”


**God wants a personal relationship with each of us, and brothers and sisters, I want to encourage you to draw near to Him now.**

In the morning, give him at least some moments before you go to work. Offer your day to Him. Ask him to help you. At the end of the day, take some time to thank God. Plan a time to read the scripture passages of the day, ponder them, and ask, “How do they apply to me?”

You may say, “I don’t have time,” but something is not in the right order if you don’t have time for God. Give Him time daily in prayer, however you need to do it. Maybe it’s fifteen minutes in the morning and fifteen minutes in the evening, or something that works for your schedule. Give God time. The more you share your heart with Him, the more you talk to Him, the more you ask Him for help, and the more you thank Him for what He has given you, the nearer and deeper your relationship with God will become. Ask the Lord to help you with this, and count on the fact that I am praying for you every day.

This past October, the id team took a few days to pray, evaluate, celebrate, and seek the Lord’s will for our work in 2022. While we anticipated the time would be fruitful and refreshing (which it was) and expected the Lord to speak, we were surprised by the clear and specific vision He gave us.

Heading into 2022, we felt called to re-invest in the greater Ann Arbor area in order to see an abundance of Spirit-filled, young adult leaders emerge who could “grow and go” by building discipleship communities. While our conviction to build communities and invest in leaders around the world is as strong as ever (more on that later), we realized the great need to drill down deeper in our own backyard since the Lord has always used those efforts to inform and purify our work in other places. We want discipleship communities to be the prevailing and recognized culture for young adult Catholics in Ann Arbor, and I’m happy to report we are making progress toward that dream.

To engage the Ann Arbor community, we organized family dinners, worship nights, women’s small groups, a weekly group for young mothers, and a men’s formation cohort for Advent. We believe Spirit-filled leadership is essential for developing authentic Christian community and mission, so this past Lent, we led over thirty young adults through our nine-week, Spirit-Filled Leadership course. Each week, we gathered for worship, a short teaching, and small-group triads. The expectation was for participants to take what they were learning and utilize it throughout the week. The Spirit-Filled Leadership course is the bedrock of our efforts in our communities. It’s amazing to see potential leaders grow in their understanding of God’s call on their lives during the course and learn how to navigate their lives together as disciples practicing the way of Jesus. Here’s what one participant said about it:

*“Before becoming a part of the discipleship community (DC), I had no intentional faith community. I attended a local parish and had Catholic friends, but no group that I could call a community. In the DC, I have finally found that community. We’ve gone from a group of acquaintances to true friends. Even in the midst of the pandemic, God generously blessed this group with joy, peace, and faithfulness to one another. I’ve learned so much from them, and I can’t imagine my life without my DC.”*

Ann Arbor has a long way to go, but the Lord is raising up a new generation of people who want to abide with the Father, become like the Son, and live in the power of the Holy Spirit.

As we've invested locally, we haven't ignored outward expansion! When COVID-19 hit in the spring of 2020, we recalibrated the Spirit-Filled Leaders course into a fully digital opportunity called the Spirit-Filled Leaders Intensive course (SFLi). To date, over 700 people worldwide have taken the thirty-day course! A few Australian young adult leaders went through and loved the SFLi, which spawned some conversations with them about formally bringing the id model to the diocese of Perth. We now have our first official Australian id community led by about twenty dynamic young adult leaders who have embraced the vision of discipleship communities and are working to see them grow! ○

Additionally, some of our existing communities continue to thrive and demonstrate the potential to be "hubs" or places where people could visit to really experience what God is doing through id. In particular, our friends in Jacksonville, Florida, have seen inspiring growth. What started as one bought-in pastor and two leaders has multiplied into two cohorts of people who've gone through the Spirit-Filled Leaders course and then grown into four discipleship communities. Josie, one of our key leaders, said this:

*"id has been an incredible blessing to the young adult community of Jacksonville. There is a need for what they are doing within the Church. Many young adults are searching for com-*

*munity. They want to share in fellowship, faith, and service of the broader community with others, but unfortunately, many parishes do not provide an opportunity for this kind of community. The discipleship communities that id is helping to form have the potential to transform churches, communities, and entire cities."*

### **God is on the move in Jacksonville!**

We've found that people are more willing to commit to the lifestyle of Spirit-filled leadership and discipleship communities if they've had a previous experience of dynamic faith formation or if they were personally blessed by hearing or watching the message the Lord has put in our hearts. We are excited and grateful for numerous opportunities to preach and teach at parishes, schools, Legatus chapters, diocesan assemblies, conferences, and online. Everywhere we go, we are inspired to remind everyone that Jesus is Lord, heaven and hell are real, holiness and mission are non-negotiable, and a full life in the Spirit is normative in the life of a disciple.

The entire id team expects God to move in and through our lives. We are constantly looking for opportunities to share the Gospel and to invite people to experience new or deeper conversion! In particular, our id missionaries, led by Rachel Herbeck, have been investing in young adults from all walks of life, ministering to their needs, and inviting them deeper. Please join us in praying for more and more young adults to meet Jesus and more doors to open across the world for us to bring the Living Word which has been placed in our hearts.

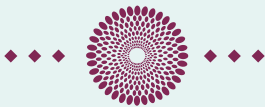

# THE LORD EQUIPS THE CALLED Q&A

with Nancy Greenhaw  
Renewal Ministries' Country Coordinator



This month we offer you a glimpse into the inspirational life of one of Renewal Ministries' missionaries, Nancy Greenhaw. Jointly called by the Lord with her husband, Lloyd, Nancy has had the great privilege of bringing the Gospel to an astounding twenty-six countries multiple times a year, beginning in 2000. Considering this impressive track record, it was inspiring to hear that being a missionary was not among Nancy's childhood ambitions but is simply a result of her and Lloyd giving their hearts to the Lord.



Nancy, thank you for sharing a part of your story with our readers. Can you give us a little of your personal background?

Lloyd and I have been married for fifty-seven years. We were both born in Texas in the San Antonio area and currently live in Fredericksburg, Texas, on acreage I inherited from my dad and mother, Otto and Irene Klein. Right now, we belong to Saint Anthony's Catholic Church in Harper, Texas. We have two married daughters, fourteen grandchildren, and twenty great-grandchildren! We are so incredibly blessed!

My parents were descendants of the Germans that came here to settle the land and did not speak English very well. When I was about eight or nine years old, a teacher told my parents, "Nancy is not smart. She will never make it to college, so don't waste your money." That lie or opinion became a part of me, and I was convinced that I had no future outside of marriage. At age fourteen, I met my future Evangelical husband. We fell in love, and the rest is history. With the blessings of our parents, we got married when I was 16, and he was 20 years old. I never went back to high school nor received any other formal education after our

children were born, although I have attended many schools and workshops relative to the ministry we serve.

You've shared that being a missionary was not something you dreamed about as a child nor set out to do on purpose as an adult, and yet, you and Lloyd have gone to an astonishing twenty-six countries to preach the Good News! Can you tell us how this happened?

After we were married, Lloyd and I lived and worked in the San Antonio, Texas, area for years. Due to a job opportunity, we moved to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in the early 1980s. We lived in this very Catholic state for about eight years. Because of some family problems we were experiencing, I was desperate to find peace in my heart. The Holy Spirit led us to a Catholic small group where we had the incredible opportunity to make Jesus the Lord of our lives and to choose to be baptized in the Holy Spirit. I would later hear Ralph Martin say these decisions were the best decisions we ever made and changed the direction and focus of both Lloyd's and my life. Lloyd would eventually become the prayer group leader at St. George Catholic Church in Baton Rouge.

After that, we moved to St. Petersburg, Florida, because of Lloyd's business. While there, we joined the Presence of God prayer group and began to preach, do music in some prisons, sit and block abortion clinics, and really got involved in feeding the homeless on Sundays in Tampa. We were also invited to give Life in the Spirit Seminars in some other parishes. Lloyd was on the All-Florida Commission of the Catholic Charismatic Renewal. Because of this exposure, we were invited to do Evangelization Schools with Greg Trainor, founder of Preach Jesus, Inc., in South Florida. From there, we were asked to go to Cuba in 1994. We raised our own money for this, our first foreign mission. It was incredible!

We saw many, many miracles on this first trip. Going to Cuba lit our fire for mission work! Since then, we have not been on a trip that had so many visible miracles. We were there for close to a month. Then, the Lord sent us to Estonia, and through the leading of the Holy Spirit, we got involved with Renewal Ministries. Our first trip with Renewal was to Ghana, Africa, in 2000.

**Do you and Lloyd always travel together? And tell us a bit of what it is like to minister together as a couple.**

Lloyd and I were called to do mission work together, and so, yes, we have always traveled together except in 2019, when he got quite ill in South Africa, and I went on without him to Botswana before we flew back to the US together.

We have found out that we are a pretty good team. Both of our weakest areas have strengths in the other partner. We have found that there is a special connection, a strength, in a sacramental marriage. I feel we are stronger together than apart. He is the head of this team, and the Lord works through that. I have experienced it many times.

We prepare for our trips together in the fact that we talk and pray about our upcoming mission. We ask, "What is it they're asking for? Speaking to priests or youth or leaders? Do they want the

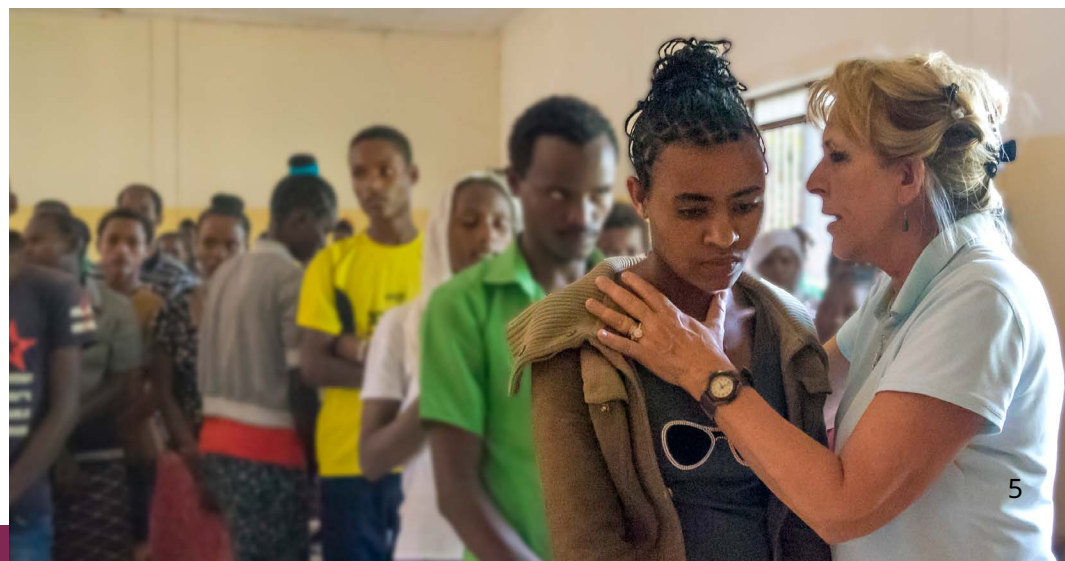
Five Keys of the Unbound ministry? Do they want apologetics?" We pray about it separately and then come back together to see what the Lord is telling us.

We rarely preach together. If they give us an hour to talk, that means we each get thirty minutes, which is not long enough most of the time. So, depending on what they want, I will give up my time to him or vice versa.

**When we look at the photographs of you and Lloyd on mission, there are so many beautiful ones of you teaching, but also of you dancing! How else do you minister on these trips?**



Well, when I first started going on mission trips, I was always dancing and praising the Lord and worshiping with everyone because I grew up dancing. I used to bring flags, and the people loved the flags, too. The Lord knew dancing would be a perfect fit in the African countries we visited, and also sharing our karaoke-style music to break the ice.



I would also pray over long lines of people. I would do some of the teaching, but Lloyd would do most of it. Then in 2004, and each year for several more years, we took Neal and Janet Lozano, founders of Heart of the Father Ministries, to Rwanda, Sudan, and Uganda. I got to sit at the "masters' feet" and learn, experience, and pray using the Unbound prayer ministry model, which they pioneered. Because of seeing the freedom people experienced, I was convinced that this model of prayer was truly applying the Gospel to a person's personal life. This is the model I now use for much of my teaching and praying over people.

**Nancy, you are also an award-winning watercolor artist and teacher and an acrylic and digital artist. One of the gifts you bring back from your mission trips and share with Renewal Ministries' supporters are amazing photographs of the places you and Lloyd have been and the people you have encountered. Tell us a little about how you developed these artistic gifts from the Lord.**



My mother and I came into the world of art through the back door. She had done so many creative things in her life that we were both convinced that she could also create paintings. We joined oil painting classes together, but my children were very small then, and I didn't have the time that she had. She went on to become a recognized artist in a group called "Texas Hill Country

Artists" and had her work published in a book called *Fredericksburg, Texas; 150 years of Painting and Drawings*.

Once my daughters were in school, I could also pursue my craft. I have pursued drawing classes for many years, and I took many workshops with successful artists. I won many juried contests and sold my craft for years, as well as taught art and attended workshops in several states. I have used my artistic talents in photography and video production for Renewal Ministries for the last twenty years.

You have been pretty much around the world and back again. Can you share any memorable moments from the mission field?

Oh, my goodness, I have so many stories! I have seen blind eyes opened, the deaf hear, an 8-year-old girl who had polio from birth totally healed, and food multiplied. A woman, who experienced unspeakable atrocities during the Rwandan genocide, like men murdering her family in front of her, was incredibly able to forgive them. God physically healed a bishop from a certain country from three separate illnesses over three separate years. I have watched people make a decision that Jesus is their only Lord and Savior, choose to never go to the local witch doctor again, and go on to tell others about this. I have watched a priest change through a couple of years from a depressed, angry alcoholic to an "on-fire" man of God. I praise the Lord of Glory for helping me every step of the way, for sending his Holy Spirit to lead me.

What about any memorably humorous moments?

Once, when we were in Samoa, they commented that it was so great that we were ministering there during the Palolo season. Palolo are sea worms that appear only a few nights of the year. They float up from the coral to the water's surface, where they are scooped up with nets. Eating them is a tradition going back for generations. Being iridescent, they have to be gathered at night as they rise to the surface of the ocean reefs. They are eaten raw. As they put this in front of me, I remembered the admonition of Jesus to his disciples from Luke 10:8, "Whenever you enter a town, and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you."

Gulp! Well, I knew if I tried to slide it down my throat, it might come back up. So, I got up and sat in another place that didn't have the worms wiggling. The worms weren't sitting right before me, so I wasn't exactly being disobedient!!! The Samoans either didn't notice or were forever gracious to this outsider.

What might our readers learn from your experiences and take away for being missionaries right where they are?

I think Renewal Ministries' supporters need to know what their donations have accomplished. I remembered what John Paul Ngotty, Coordinator of Healing Ministry at Catholic Charismatic Renewal Tanzania, told me. He said that since 2015 when I taught him, and about one hundred leaders from many

other countries in Africa, the Unbound model of prayer ministry, he has gone on to teach it to over 9,000 people in Africa! This was only possible through donations to Renewal Ministries.

Thousands of people have been healed and set free by the Lord because somebody was there to speak the Word of God to them. It is God who heals and sets free, but someone has to bring the Good News. That costs money, and many people would have been lost without supporters' donations. It is not just we, the family at Renewal Ministries, who have done this. It is all of us together working for the kingdom.

The Lord can even use fools, the uneducated, the reticent, the sinner like me. He can take the little bit that we can give to Him and make it so much more. He is waiting for our "yes." Nobody has been more surprised than I have been at what the Lord has done in my life and how He has used me. After seeing Him work, now I know that his heart is aching for souls. He wants freedom and healing for his people. That's why He died; He came to set people free! "The Son of God was revealed for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil" (1 John 3:8).

I now believe and know that "God doesn't call the equipped, but He equips the called."

There is no doubt that all of us are called. We, the Church, exist to evangelize, whether it is in missions of Africa or missions of your friends and the family, which is admittedly more of a challenge!

I had a conversion in 2011. The Lord put it in my heart to evangelize with Renewal Ministries' booklets. I put them in my church hall as well as give them to people randomly. They feed my soul and help me evangelize without much effort - what a blessing! Our Lord knows what we need before we do. I am presently Vice Prefect in a Rosary group at my parish. I intend to give each group member a *Join the Resistance* booklet, explain my mission to them, and ask them to pass the booklet along when they are done reading it. I am blessed to have a resource of holy Catholic laypeople in Renewal Ministries to write and preach and save souls for the greater glory of God. Thank you!

We recently bought some more booklets to share about hope. We purchased *Hope in the Midst of Suffering* by Sr. Ann Shields and *Is There Any Hope for Me?* by Dr. Martin.

It is our goal to evangelize, but we have never done this with so much misinformation in society. We have come to understand that many things declared in the Gospels are there to be read. Recently, we were watching Bishop Fulton Sheen concerning Jesus and the Cross. He explains that it should NOT be separated in faith. We read and listen to Mr. Ralph in-depth and rely on his wisdom to guide us and “link the dots.” We are not that well educated, but we MUST be careful who we follow. Maybe it will help us understand our need for Jesus.

I have purchased a number of *Join the Resistance* booklets and am using them for our men's group. We have two groups. Our pastor has agreed to pray for each of the groups the week before Easter for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit (or whatever description he comes up with for the prayer). The booklets are to prepare the men for the blessing. We are experiencing the Spirit in our groups quite a lot and hope for more.

I am a pastor and use these resources with parishioners that come to my office. These are helpful for their spiritual growth.

I have a prayer group and pro-life center that I stock with this book.

We give the booklets away for free, and our only request is for people to read them and hand them to someone else. We have had great success with that method. The handing-off makes the person receiving feel obligated to read the book because their friend gave it to them for free, and then they will want to discuss it.

I encourage members of our small prayer group to take, read, and share the booklets I have purchased. I put booklets in the giveaway places at church. I give the *New Pentecost* booklets to people when I invite them to the prayer meeting. We pray for Renewal Ministries regularly.

I initially ordered one free copy of *Fear God & Give Him Glory*. It touched my heart, because there are so many people I know who just don't know this truth. I ordered more booklets because I just gave my copy of *Fear God & Give Him Glory* to a fallen-away Catholic who has joined an Evangelical Church. Even though he is critical of the Church, he was interested in keeping it for further reflection.

I belong to a scripture study group of women. I plan to distribute some of these booklets to them and hope it will prompt them to obtain more copies to share with others. I am considering leaving a booklet at a coffee shop that I go to frequently. My husband and I, unfortunately, have relatives who are fallen-away Catholics. We are considering sending each family a copy.

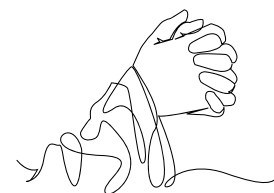
